





2: Socio-Demographics and Housing

I.Preserve established neighborhoods.


2.Control scale & density and target new development in previously developed areas.

3.Enhance Inclusionary Housing Requirements to reach deeper affordability levels.

4. Consider Accessory Dwelling Units limited to owner-occupied single-family homes to provide another option for seniors.

5. Promote affordable homeownership.

6. Support organizations that help the homeless.




3: Land Use and Zoning

Forest Ave & Brewster St: study zoning changes to align permitted uses to existing context

North side of the waterfront: remove zoning barriers to spur investment of a few big parcels that have vacancies or outdated uses


Glen Street and Sea Cliff LIRR Stations: consider overlay zones to allow mixed-use development that fits with the existing context



4: Transportation and Parking

- Continue to enhance the safety and efficiency of Glen Cove's roadways.
- Extend Highland Road through to Brewster Street.
- Enhance connections from downtown to the waterfront.
- Invest in parking facilities and study parking management strategies.
- Partner with Nassau County to explore bus service upgrades, with a focus on the potential for ondemand transit service.





5: Downtown and Economic Development

- Support existing businesses through technology support, marketing efforts, broadband access and grant opportunities
- Diversify Downtown businesses to create a 16-hour/7 day downtown
- Create an entertainment anchor downtown
- Increase nightlife, weekend activities and events in collaboration with the BID, Chamber of Commerce, and North Shore Hispanic Chamber of Commerce
- Improve streetscape consistency and uniformity throughout the commercial areas



6: Natural Resources, Climate Change and Resilience

- Wetlands
- Coastal erosion
- Sea level rise
- Flooding / storm surge
- Sustainability and energy conservation efforts
- Green infrastructure

7: Infrastructure and Utilities


